Report on the Business Trip to Canada – March 1st – 9th, 2023

March 1st

After arriving in Edmonton via Vancouver from Narita, a car was rented, and we settled into the hotel.

March 2nd

AM: Conducted online virtual meeting with Vanessa Ostapchuck of the Edmonton Waste Management Facility. The facility looks like a good place for our students to see how the issue of waste management is being handled in Alberta, Canada.

PM: Visited and toured the TELUS Science Center. It was determined that this facility would be a good place for students to learn English while studying simple topics connected to science.





March 3rd



AM: Visited and toured the South Edmonton facilities for ATCO Energy. The tour gave us a brief explanation and history of the ATCO company and we discussed various engineering sites that the students could visit. We then did a tour of the gas pipeline control center and decided that this would be a very good educational opportunity for our students. The subject matter is quite advanced so students will be required to study about these sites before they go on the trip to Canada.

PM: Visited the Royal Alberta Museum. This site would be a good half-day tour for students that will help them understand a little bit about the history of the land and people of Alberta, Canada.

March 4th



AM: Conducted a self-guided tour of the university of Alberta Campus. We walked through various Engineering buildings and Education buildings. We ended our tour by examining the physical education facilities as well. Students will be able to tour the same sites in September and negotiations are still underway about the activities. We have been assured that we will have a <u>guided</u> tour for our students in September at the least. Classroom and lab visits are also possible.





PM: Visited the Old Strathcona and Whyte Avenue areas of Edmonton. These areas will provide students with a chance to see local area small businesses and some local Edmonton historical sites. This will provide the students with a greater understanding of Canadian authentic modern lifestyle and history.




March 5th
